AFP Remaining Funds Options

The purpose of this meeting is to address the AFP tied projects. The tied projects were tabled at the previous meeting to allow staff time to get recommendations on how the remaining funds can be allocated.

Vonda Martin presented options below based on feedback from DNCR Finance and Legal. The options and projects were read aloud for those participating in the meeting via audio only.

Options for Remaining AFP Funds

Option 1: Offer to Surry County, the 4th project tied in the votes. Surry County requested \$500,000. Their total project cost is \$600,000, with a \$100,000 local match. Surry County has already verbally not accepted this offer.

Option 2: Add funding to some of the projects already awarded AFP. Divide the remaining \$96,875 between the 8 projects who overmatched their grant requests, giving each of these projects an additional \$12,109 in the grant award to invest in their project or to reduce their local overmatched funds by this amount.

Option 3: Hold the funds until PARTF funding and award to PARTF applicant(s) going above the inclusion minimums. This would be for future PARTF projects that go above access and inclusion minimum requirements and thus would be eligible for the AFP funding. The matching grants can be used to build special facilities or adapt existing facilities that meet the unique needs of children and/or veterans living with physical and developmental disabilities.

LOWER HAW STATE NATURAL AREA

Project: Day-Use Area Location: Chatham County Funds Requested: \$1,592,274

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Lower Haw State Natural is located in Chatham County near the town of Bynum. This day-use area is located on the former mill site and will serve as day-use area for paddling, hiking and wildlife observation. This project was funded by the 2016 Connect NC Bond. Additional funding is requested related to inflation, original funding only provided 75 percent of the total cost and upgrading the toilet building to a flush toilet. Project will include a new toilet building, improved car parking lots, site utilities, and trail to river for canoe/kayak put in/takeout area.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Wire Pasture Development project is in Robeson County near Maxton. The day-use site is situated on the Lumber River in between the Chalk Banks access and the Princess Anne access. Project will provide day-use to this historically used water access location. Project will include a visitor contact station, paved access road, vehicle parking area, gazebo shelter, and minor site improvements and amenities. The contact station will include park offices, a small retail area, exhibits, public restrooms, a changing area, and a classroom. Site amenities will include an educational trail with wayside exhibits, picnic area, and river beach access improvements. All facilities will meet state building code and ADA compliance.

At the direction of the State Construction Office and the Department of Insurance the Division has been requested to upgrade their fire suppression system to meet current code. Since the Sky Lounge is extremely remote a unique system is necessary to meet the appropriate code. This project will install the new system and bring the Sky Lounge up to meet the state building fire code.

LAKE WACCAMAW STATE PARK

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Lake Waccamaw State Park currently provides only primitive camping options. This new campground will provide for overnight facilities for RV's, tents and cabins. Initial funding for the project was provided by the Connect NC Bond of 2016. Additional funding is requested related to inflation, original funding only provided 75 percent of the total cost and expansion of the project footprint. The project will include a new campground shower house, campsites (8) RV full hookup (water, sewer, electric), (2) new camper cabins, (12) tent site improvements, campsite amenities, new campground road, all needed utilities (septic system, water, electric). All facilities will meet state building code and ADA compliance.

MULTIPLE PARKS

Project: EV Chargers Location: Hanging Rock, Jones Lake and Stone Mountain State Parks Funds Requested: \$93,240

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this project is to add 3 new EV fast chargers at Hanging Rock, Jones Lake and Stone Mountain State Parks. By installing chargers at free, public venues that attract large populations, the State Parks system is facilitating broad public access to charging infrastructure that is convenient and accessible. The Park system will allow drivers to charge their vehicles for free, alleviating financial barriers to switching to green technology and making electric vehicles within reach for more people to accelerate the adoption of zero emissions vehicles.
