

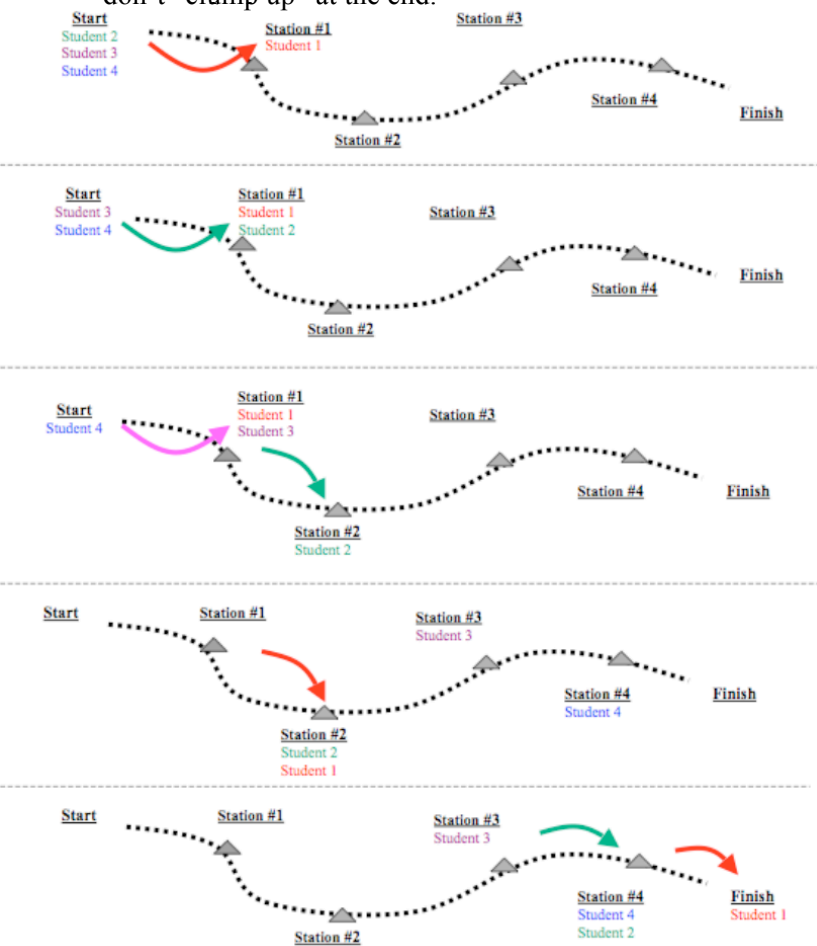
Each One Teach One, or The Walking–Talking Nature Trail

Students will gain experience teaching each other and learning from each other.

DO – *experience the activity hands-on*

Instructions:

1. Find a section of trail or a field where there are plenty of interesting things to study in nature. Prepare fact cards or activity cards related stations along the trail.
2. Give each student something to teach or a fact card. They will be teaching this to everyone else in the group. Give them some time to decide how they are going to teach their information.
3. Begin by walking with the 1st student to learning station #1. After 30 seconds, send the 2nd student to learn from the 1st student. Once the 2nd student has learned from the 1st student, they will continue along the trail to teach at learning station #2. *See schematic below.*
4. It is important to clearly explain to students that each person only teaches one person at a time. As the last person comes to learning station #1, one student will have to wait so that students don't "clump up" at the end.



REFLECT & APPLY – *share the experience and connect with real world examples*

Questions:

- 1.) What was it like learning from one of your peers?
- 2.) What was something interesting you learned?
- 3.) Was there anything interesting you saw at a station that was not the “subject” being taught? For instance, wildlife sightings.
- 4.) Was there anything you did or heard that you know you are going to remember? Why do you think you will remember it?
